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Feminine Scarves and Shawls

Biased Opinion Scarf

By: Vickie Howell for Caron Yarn

Knit with straight knitting needles, this sensational Biased Opinion Scarf is just what Mom needs! It's an easy-to-make gift that's also practical and stylish. Have we sold you yet?



Finished Measurement

Approximately 8"/20.5cm wide (measured along the bias) x 60"/152.5cm long, not including fringe

Materials

- Stitch.Rock.Love. Sheep(ish) from Caron (70% Acrylic/30% Wool; 3oz/85g, 167yds/153m) Shown in: #0021 Lime(ish): 2 balls
- One pair size U.S. 9 (5.5mm) knitting needles, or size to obtain gauge
- One size U.S. K-10.5 (6.5mm) crochet hook (for fringe only).
- Yarn Needle

Gauge

In Bias Pattern on size U.S 9 (5.5mm) needle, $17 \text{ sts} = 4^{"}/10 \text{cm}$. Gauge is not critical for this project.

Special Stitch: pf&b: Purl in front and back of same stitch —1 st increased

Instructions

SCARF

CO 33 sts.

Row 1 (RS): K2tog, k1, *p2, k2; repeat from * to last 2 sts, p1, pf&b.

Row 2: P1, k2, *p2, k2; repeat from * to last 2 sts, p2.

Row 3: K2tog, *p2, k2; repeat from * to last 3 sts, p2, pf&b.

Row 4: *K2, p2; repeat from * to last st, k1. **Repeat Rows 1–4** until piece measures 60"/152.5cm from beginning. BO in patt.


FINISHING

Using yarn needle, weave in all ends.

Fringe (optional)

Cut 12"/30.5cm strands of yarn. Holding 5 strands together, fold fringe in half. Using crochet hook, *insert hook from WS to RS into short end of Scarf and into folded strands, pull folded strands through forming a loop, insert ends into loop and pull tight against edge; repeat from * working 11 fringes evenly spaced across. Repeat across other end of Scarf.

Sashay Awhile Scarf By: Red Heart Yarn

Perfect for the Mom who's a romantic at heart, this scarf features gorgeous cascading ruffles created by using Red Heart's Sashay yarn. As charming as an evening in Paris, this scarf brings a romantic vibe to any outfit.



Materials

- Red Heart Boutique™ "Sashay™":1 ball 1937 Mambo A
- Red Heart "Soft": 1 ball 4604 Navy B
- Knitting needles: 5.5mm [US 9] circular needle, 29" long or longer
- Yarn needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching thread

GAUGE: Gauge is not essential for this project.

Instructions

To work with Sashay, hold ribbon of yarn with metallic end at bottom and 'railroad track' at top.

To cast-on, insert needle into every other loop of 'railroad track', from back to front.

To knit, insert right hand needle into next loop on left hand needle knitwise. Skip every other loop at top of 'railroad track', place next loop of Sashay onto tip of right hand needle, from front to back. Draw loop through and complete stitch as for normal knit stitch.

With A, cast on 143 sts, inserting needle into every other loop to put sts onto needle.| **Rows 1-4:** With B, k1, *p1, k1; repeat from * to end of row.

Rows 5 and 6: With A, knit to end of row.
Rows 7 and 8: With B, k1, *p1, k1; repeat from * to end of row.

Rows 9 and 10: With B, knit to end of row. Bind off.

With yarn needle, weave in B ends. With sewing needle and thread, tack A ends to underside of ruffles.

Ruffled Arizona Scarf

By: Lion Brand Yarn

This carefree scarf is perfect for the laid back mom who is still young at heart. Knit this basic knit scarf in her favorite colors to give her a gift she'll cherish for years.



Materials

- 790-407 Homespun Yarn: Painted Desert: 2 balls
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles Size 10 [6 mm]
- Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

Skill Level: Easy

Size: One Size

About 8 x 56 in. (20.5 x 142 cm)

Gauge: 1 sts = 4 in. (10 cm) in St st (k on RS, p on WS) BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE. When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Instructions

SCARF

Cast on 22 sts. Row 1 (WS): Purl.

Row 2 (RS): K17, turn; leave rem 5 sts

unworked. Row 3: P17.

Row 4: K12, turn; leave rem 10 sts unworked.

Row 5: P12.

Row 6: K7, turn; leave rem 15 sts unworked.

Row 7: P7.

Row 8: K across 22 sts.

Rep Rows 1–8 until piece measures about 56 in. (142 cm) at widest point, end with a Row 8. Bind off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

One Shoulder Shawl

By: Sam Leaver for Red Heart Yarn

Knit shawls and wraps are great additions to a summer or spring dress. This Soft Shoulder Shawl from Red Heart Yarn casual enough to be worn with jeans, but classy enough to be formal wear. It's perfect for Mom!



Materials

- RED HEART® "Mystic™": 2 Balls 0830 Cornflower
- Knitting Needles: 6mm [US 10]
- Yarn needle

Instructions

GAUGE: 15 sts = 4"; 20 rows = 4" in pattern st, unblocked. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

Special Abbreviations

- k3tog = knit 3 stitches together.
- k3tog tbl = knit 3 stitches together through back loops.
- sk2p = slip next stitch knitwise to right needle, knit 2 stitches together, pass slipped stitch over.
- ssk = slip next two stitches knitwise to right needle, insert point of left needle through front of sts, knit these sts together through back loop.

Instructions

Cast on 5 sts.

Row 1 (Right Side): Knit.

Row 2 And All Wrong Side Rows: K2, purl to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 3: K2, yo, k1, yo, k2 – 7 sts.

Row 5: K2, yo, k3, yo, k2 – 9 sts.

Row 7: K2, yo, k5, yo, k2 – 11 sts.

Row 9: K3, yo, k5, yo, k3 – 13 sts.

Row 11: K2, yo, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, ssk, yo, k2 – 15 sts.

Row 13: K2, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, ssk, k1, yo, k2 – 17 sts.

Row 15: K3, yo, k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo, k3, yo, k3 – 19 sts.

Row 17: K3, yo, k5, yo, sk2p, yo, k5, yo, k3 – 21 sts.

Row 19: K2, yo, k2, yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo, k2, yo, k2 – 23 sts.

Row 21: K2, yo, k4, yo, sk2p, yo, k5, yo, sk2p, yo, k4, yo, k2 – 25 sts.

Row 23: K2, [yo, k5, yo, sk2p] twice, yo, k5, yo, k2 – 27 sts.

Row 25: K3, [yo, k5, yo, sk2p] twice, yo, k5, yo, k3 – 29 sts.

Row 27: K2, yo, k2tog, [yo, k5, yo, sk2p] twice, yo, k5, yo, ssk, yo, k2 – 31 sts.

Row 29: K2, [yo, k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k1] 3 times, yo, k3, yo, k2 – 33 sts.

Row 31: K2, [yo, k5, yo, sk2p] 3 times, yo, k5, yo, k2 – 35 sts.

Row 33: K2, yo, k1, [yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo, k3] 3 times, yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo, k1, yo, k2 – 37 sts.

Row 35: K2, yo, k3, [yo, sk2p, yo, k5] 3 times, yo, sk2p, yo, k3, yo, k2 – 39 sts.

Row 37: K2, yo, k4, [yo, sk2p, yo, k5] 3 times, yo, sk2p, yo, k4, yo, k2 – 41 sts.

Row 39: K2, [yo, k5, yo, sk2p] 4 times, yo, k5, yo, k2 – 43 sts.

Row 41: K3, [yo, k5, yo, sk2p] 4 times, yo, k5, yo, k3 – 45 sts.

Lace Middle Section

Row 1: K4, [yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo, k3] 5 times, k1 – 45 sts.

Row 2 And All Wrong Side Rows: K2, purl to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 3: [K5, yo, sk2p, yo] 5 times, k5.

Row 5: K2, k2tog, k1, [yo, k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k1] 4 times, yo, k3, yo, k1, ssk, k2.

Row 7: K2, k2tog, yo, [k5, yo, sk2p, yo] 4 times, k5, yo, ssk, k2.

Row 9: K2, k2tog, yo, [k5, yo, sk2p, yo] 4 times, k5, yo, ssk, k2.

Row 11: K2, k2tog, yo, [k5, yo, sk2p, yo] 4 times, k5, yo, ssk, k2.

Row 13: K2, k2tog, yo, [k5, yo, sk2p, yo] 4 times, k5, yo, ssk, k2.

Row 14: K2, purl to last 2 st, k2.

Repeat Rows 1-14 for 14 times more, then Rows 1-2 once.

Decreased Point

Row 1: K2, k2tog, k1, yo, [sk2p, yo, k5, yo] 4 times, sk2p, yo, k1, k2tog, k2 – 43 sts.

Row 2 And All Wrong Side Rows: K2, purl to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 3: K1, k3tog, yo, [k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo] 4 times, k3, yo, k3tog tbl, k1 – 41 sts.

Row 5: K7, [yo, sk2p, yo, k5] 4 times, k2 – 41 sts.

Row 7: K2, k2tog, k3, yo, [sk2p, yo, k5, yo] 3 times, sk2p, yo, k3, ssk, k2 – 39 sts.

Row 9: K2, k2tog, k2, yo, [sk2p, yo, k5, yo] 3 times, sk2p, yo, k2, ssk, k2 – 37 sts.

Row 11: K2, k2tog, k1, yo, [sk2p, yo, k5, yo] 3 times, sk2p, yo, k1, k2tog, k2 – 35 sts.

Row 13: K1, k3tog, yo, [k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo] 3 times, k3, yo, k3tog tbl, k1 – 33 sts.

Row 15: K7, [yo, sk2p, yo, k5] 3 times, k2 – 33 sts

Row 17: K3, sk2p, k1, yo, [k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo] twice, k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k3 – 31 sts.

Row 19: K2, [sk2p, yo, k5, yo] 3 times, sk2p, k2 - 29 sts.

Row 21: K1, k3tog, yo, [k5, yo, sk2p, yo] twice, k5, yo, k3tog tbl, k1 – 27 sts.

Row 23: K1, k2tog, [k5, yo, sk2p, yo] twice, k5, ssk, k1 – 25 sts.

Row 25: K1, k2tog, k4, yo, sk2p, yo, k5, yo, sk2p, yo, k4, ssk, k1 – 23 sts.

Row 27: K2, sk2p, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k2 – 21 sts.

Row 29: K1, [sk2p, yo, k5, yo] twice, sk2p, k1 – 19 sts.

Row 31: K4, sk2p, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1, sk2p, k4 – 17 sts.

Row 33: K3, sk2p, yo, k5, yo, sk2p, k3 – 15 sts. **Row 35:** K2, sk2p, yo, k5, yo, sk2p, k2 – 13 sts. **Row 37:** K1, sk2p, yo, k5, yo, sk2p, k1 – 11 sts.

Row 39: K3tog, yo, k5, yo, k3tog tbl – 9 sts.

Row 41: K3, sk2p, k3 – 7 sts.

Row 43: K2, sk2p, k2 – 5 sts.

Row 45: K1, sk2p, k1 – 3 sts.

Bind off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Wash in warm water with mild detergent and pin out to dry on clean surface to block to final measurements.

Easy Knit Bags

Elegant Summer Clutch

Help Mom stay organized by knitting her this adorable summer clutch. Not only is it super easy to construct, but it's perfect for casual and dressy events alike!



Materials

- 1 skein of Red Heart Yarn (BLACK)
 U.S. size 11 and 10 straight knitting needles
- Hold 2 strands of yarn together throughout this project

Instructions

Purse

CO 25 sts. Or multiple of 5

Row 1: Knit 12 rows in garter stitch

Row 2: Knit 12 rows in stockinette st.

Row 3: Knit 24 rows in garter st.

Row 4: Knit 12 rows in stockinette st.

Row 5: Knit 12 rows in garter stitch

Row 6: BO first 4 stitches in the next row,

Row 7: Continue knitting across the row

Then BO the first 4 stitches in the next row continue knitting across the row. Knit for 4

more inches. BO all stitches.

Fold the piece together up to where the flap begins and sew up the sides. I added a button just to break the monotony of all black. There is no buttonhole.

Strap

Using size 10 needles, CO 40 stitches, (remember to hold to strands together): knit one row and then BO. I sewed the strap ends together then attached it to the side of the purse. The strap can be tucked into the purse to use as a clutch purse.

Easy Entrelac Clutch

By: Tagil Perlmutter for Petite Purls

Entrelac knitting patterns can be used to make more than scarves - check out this handy pouch, for instance. Whether you use this bag to store pencils, money or make up, your mom will love the rich texture of this project.



Materials

Pink and White version:

- Spud & Chloe Sweater [55% wool, 45% organic cotton; 160 yards/146 meters per 100 gram hank];
- #7500 Ice Cream; 1 hank
- #7512 Watermelon; 1 hank

Brown and Blue version:

- Spud & Chloë™ Sweater [55% wool, 45% organic cotton; 160 yards/146 meters per 100 gram hank];
- #7511 Chipmunk; 1 hank
- Bernat Cottontots [100% cotton; 171 yards/156 meters per 3 ounce/85 gram skein];

- #90105 Country Blue; 1 skein
- US #7/4.5 mm needles
- Cotton fabric, 11 x 12 inches for the simple lining or 11 x 25 inches for the advanced version
- Sewing pins
- 10 inch Zipper
- Sewing needles and thread
- Pattern see below

Gauge: 18 sts and 24 rows = 4 inches in St st after blocking. Exact gauge is not important in this project.

Pattern Notes: The case is worked in one piece using Entrelac technique throughout.

Instructions

Using MC cast on 24 sts – very loosely.

Row 1: K2, turn.

Row 2: P2, turn.

Row 3: K3, turn.

Row 4: P3, turn.

Row 5: K4, turn.

Row 6: P4, turn.

Row 7: K5, turn. **Row 8:** P5, turn.

10W 0. 1 3, turn.

Row 9: K8, turn.

Repeat Rows 2- 9 two more time.

Repeat Rows 2-8

Last Row: K6 (all sts have been worked and you have now 4 triangles on the left needle), turn.

First Tier of Blocks

This tier consists of 2 side triangles and 3 middle blocks:

With WS facing change to CC and work as follows:

Left Side Triangle

Row 1: P2, turn.

Row 2: K1, m1, k1, turn.

Row 3: P2, p2tog (one st from Side Triangle and one st from Base Triangle),

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turn.

Row 4: K2, m1, k1.

Row 5: P3, p2tog, turn.

Row 6: K3, m1, k1, turn.

Row 7: P4, p2tog, turn.

Row 8: K4, m1, k1, turn.

Row 9: P5, p2tog, do not turn.

Middle Blocks (right leaning blocks)

*With WS facing, pick up 6 sts purlwise along side of the Base Triangle (or Blocks on subsequent tiers), turn.

Row 1 (RS): K6, turn.

Row 2: P5, p2tog, turn.

Rows 3-12: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 five more times, do not turn on the 12th row. Repeat from * 2 more times (3 blocks made)

Right Side Triangle

With WS facing, pick up 6 sts purlwise along side of the last Base Triangle (or Blocks on subsequent tiers), turn.

Row 1 (RS): K6, turn.

Row 2: P4, p2tog, turn.

Row 3: K5, turn.

Row 4: P3, p2tog, turn.

Row 5: K4, turn.

Row 6: P2, p2tog, turn.

Row 7: K3, turn.

Row 8: P1, p2tog, turn.

Row 9: K2, turn.

Row 10: P2tog, turn, slip last st to the right

needle

This completes the first tier of blocks. Second Tier of Blocks

This tier consists of all full blocks.

Change to MC and proceed as follows:

Block

*For the first block only: With RS facing, pick up 5 sts knitwise along the side of the triangle from the tier below, together with the 1 st in CC there are now 6 sts on the

right needle. (For all remaining blocks pick up 6 sts), turn

Row 1 (WS): P6, turn. **Row 2:** K5, ssk, turn.**

Rows 3-12: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 five more times, do not turn on the 12th row.

Third -Fifth Tiers of Blocks

Repeat First and Second Tiers, then repeat First Tier once more.

Sixth Tier – positioning the first pocket



With MC and following the instructions for the Second Tier, work the first block stopping at **.

Rows 3-9: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 three times, then repeat Row 1 once more.

Row 10: K1, bind off 4 sts, slip last st back to left needle, ssk, turn.

Row 11: P1, cast on 4 sts purlwise, p1, turn.

Row 12: K5, ssk, do not turn.

This completes the first block in the 6th tier. Work 3 more blocks as given for the 2th tier.

Seventh Tier - positioning the second pocket

With CC and following the instruction for the First Tier, work the Left Side Triangle, then work Rows 1-9 of the first block. **Row 10 (WS):** P1, bind off 4 sts, slip the last st back to the left needle, p2tog, turn.

Row 11: K1, cast on 4 sts, k1, turn. **Row 12:** P5, p2tog, do not turn.

Complete next 2 blocks and the Right Side Triangle as instructed for the First Tier.

Eighth Tier

Work same as the Second Tier.

Ninth Tier

Work same as the First Tier.

Top Triangles - Last Tier

*With RS facing and MC, pick up 5 sts along the side of the triangle of the tier below (together with the 1 st already on the right needle there are 6 sts on the right needle), turn.

Row 1 (WS): P6, turn.

Row 2: Ssk, k3, ssk, turn.

Row 3: P5, turn.

Row 4: Ssk, k2, ssk.

Row 5: P4, turn.

Row 6: Ssk k1, ssk, turn.

Row 7: P3. turn.

Row 8: Ssk, ssk, turn.

Row 9: P2, turn.

Row 10: K1, ssk, turn.

Row 11: P2, turn

Row 12: Slip 1, ssk, psso – 1 st remains, do

not turn.

Repeat from * 3 more times cut the yarn and pull through the last st.

FINISHING

- 1. Weave in ends.
- 2. Block the garment focusing on the edges to square sides; you might need to stretch the bottom a little more to match the length of the top of the garment.


Lining - simple version


- 1. Measure the finished knitted item.
- 2. Cut the lining fabric according to the final size of the knitted item allowing a little extra for the seams.
- 3. Fold the lining fabric in half with RS together and sew side seams using sewing thread.
- 4. Fold knitted item in half with RS together so that cast on and top edges meet and sew side seams using the knitting yarn.
- 5. Turn the knitted case so the RS is facing. Insert the lining fabric inside the case and pin down the fabric to the wrong side of the knitted item with wrong sides together. Fold the seam allowance at the top of the case to match the edge of the knitted item and sew together. With sewing thread, sew fold at bottom of lining to fold of knit piece.
- 6. Insert a zipper and sew in place.
- 7. With a sewing thread sew around the outer openings to create little pockets, (sewing together the knitted item and the lining fabric take extra care not to sew to the other side of the case by mistake).


Lining - advanced version (internal divisions)

- 1. The internal divider of the lining is approximately 1 inch shorter than the full height of the case.
- 2. Measure the finished knitted item.
- 3. Cut the lining fabric 8 inches longer than the final height of the knitted item, allowing a little extra on all sides for the seams.
- 4. Fold the lining in half with WS together (A to A, B to B) (see diagram for guidance) sew a line at the top of the fold to secure the fold, sew a second line 4 inches away from the center fold through both thicknesses of lines AB to create the internal divider.
- 5. Fold the lining fabric with RS together, with the center fold inside and seam AB at bottom, sew side seams together through all thicknesses. The double thickness of fabric from the center fold to seam AB is the center divider of the lining.

- 6. Fold knitted item in half with RS together so that cast on and top edges meet and sew side seams using the knitting yarn.
- 7. With RS of knitted case facing, insert the lining fabric inside the case and pin down the fabric to the wrong side of the knitted item, making sure the center divider is in the middle of the case. Fold the seam allowance at the top of the case to match the edge of the knitted item and sew together. With sewing thread, sew line AB to folded edge of knitted piece.
- 8. Insert a zipper and sew together.
- 9. With a sewing thread sew around the outer openings to create little pockets, (sewing together the knitted item and the lining fabric take extra care not to sew to the other side of the case by mistake).







Simple Hats and Socks

Orange Sherbet Easy-Fit Hat
By: Mary Jane Protus for Red Heart Yarn

If you're new to knitting or have never knitted a hat before, this Orange Sherbet Easy-Fit Hat from Red Heart Yarn is perfect for you! Embellish it with a flower or pom for extra flair!



Materials

- Red Heart® With Love™: 1 skein 1252 Mango
- Knitting Needles: 6mm [US 10]
- Yarn needle

Instructions

Hat measures 18 inches around (slightly stretched).

GAUGE: 16 sts = 4"; 20 rows = 4" in ribbing, slightly stretched. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

Hat

Cast on 70 sts.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): *Purl 2, knit 2; repeat from * to last 2 stitches, purl 2.

Row 2 (Right Side): *Knit 2, purl 2; repeat from * to last 2 stitches, knit 2.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until work measures 10 inches from beginning, ending with a wrong side row.

Shape Crown

Row 1 (Right Side): *Knit 2, purl 2 together (decrease 1 stitch); repeat from * to last 2 stitches, knit 2 – 53 stitches.

Row 2 (Wrong Side): *Purl 2, knit 1; repeat from * to last 2 stitches, purl 2.

Row 3: *Knit 2, purl 1; repeat from * to last 2 stitches, knit 2.

Row 4: Repeat Row 2.

Next Row: *Knit 2 together, purl 1; repeat from * to last 2 stitches, knit 2 – 36 stitches. **Next Row:** Purl 2, *knit 1, purl 1; repeat from * to end.

Next Row: *Knit 2 together; repeat from * to end – 18 stitches.

Next Row: Purl.

Last Row: *Knit 2 together; repeat from * to end – 9 sts.

Cut yarn leaving a long end for seaming. Weave yarn through remaining stitches; gather stitches up firmly and secure. Sew the back seam. Starting about 3 inches from the bottom, sew the seam on the reverse side, as this will be turned up for the brim.

Cable Yoga Socks

For the athletic Mom who enjoys staying in shape with Yoga, these unique socks are perfect for her! Since these socks don't have toes or heels, Mom can easily grip the yoga mat as you do yoga and still keep your feet warm. The twisted cable pattern adds great texture to these stylish yoga socks.



Materials

- Plymouth Yarn: 2 balls (50g each)
 Oceanside Organic
- Knitting Needles: Size 4 double-point knitting needles

Gauge: 24 sts = 4" on a US 4 needle over st st.

Instructions

Cuff

Loosely cast on 48 sts. *(K4, p2); repeat from * around for the first round of sts, dividing onto 3 needles, 12-12-24. Join sts in a circle, taking care not to twist, and continue in the (k4, p2) pattern for 1".

Begin Twisted Rib Stitch

Row 1: *(K4, p2); repeat from * around.

Row 2: *(RT twice, p2); repeat from * around.

Row 3: *(K4, p2); repeat from * around.

Row 4: *(K1, RT, k1, p2); repeat from* around.

Repeat Rows 1 – 4 until sock measures 4". Continue working in pattern on needles 1 and

Bind off needle 3 loosely.

Foot

Continue working in pattern on needles 1 and 2

Cast on 24 sts on needle 3.

Continue working in pattern on needles 1 and 2

On needle 3, work in (k4, p2) rib.

Continue this way, until foot of sock measures 3".

Work all needles in (k4, p2) ribbing for 1". Bind off, in rib, loosely.

Right Twist - RT: K2tog, leaving stitches on LH needle, insert RH needle from front between 2 stitches knitted together and knit first stitch again, then slid both stitches from needle together.

Passion Pink Legwarmers By: Bernat

The classic leg warmers made popular in the 80's are back! Mom will love wearing them over leggings, jeans, tights or with a skirt!



Materials

- Bernat Satin (Solids: 100 g/3.5 oz or Ombres: 80 g/2.8 oz)
- Straight Version 04423 (Flamingo) Sizes XS (S-M-L-XL)
- Solids (100 g/3.5 oz) 2 (2-3-3-3) balls or Ombres (80 g/2.8 oz) 3 (3-3-4-4) balls
- Flared Version 05733 (Bermuda) Sizes XS (S-M-L-XL)
- Solids (100 g/3.5 oz) 3 (3-3-4-4) balls or Ombres (80 g/2.8 oz) 3 (3-4-4-4) balls
- Knitting Needles: sizes 3.75 mm (U.S.
 5) and 5 mm (U.S. 8) or size needed to obtain gauge.

Measurements

To fit

• Extra Small: Girls 7-11 yrs

• Small: Teens

Medium: Teens/LadiesLarge: Teens/LadiesExtra Large: Ladies

Gauge

18 sts and 24 rows = 4 ins [10 cm] with larger needles in stocking st.

Instructions

The instructions are written for smallest size. If changes are necessary for larger sizes the instructions will be written thus (). With smaller needles, cast on 39 (43-49-55-61) sts.

1st row: (RS). K1. *P1. K1. Rep from * to end of row.

2nd row: P1. *K1. P1. Rep from * to end of

Rep last 2 rows until work from beg measures 2 ins [5 cm], ending with RS facing for next row and inc 4 (6-6-6-6) sts evenly across last row. 43 (49-55-61-67) sts.

Flared Version Only

Change to larger needles and, beg with a knit row, proceed in stocking st until work from beg measures 10 (13-13-13-13) ins [25.5 (33-33-33-33) cm], ending with RS facing for next row.

Next row: K4 (4-5-5-6). M1 (make one st by picking up horizontal loop lying before next st and knitting into back of loop). *K7 (8-9-10-11). M1. Rep from * to last 4 (5-5-6-6) sts. K4 (5-5-6-6). 49 (55-61-67-73) sts.

Work 11 rows even.

Next row: K4 (4-5-5-6). M1. *K8 (9-10-11-12). M1. Rep from * to last 5 (5-6-6-7) sts. K5 (5-6-6-7). 55 (61-67-73-79) sts.

Work 11 rows even.

Next row: K4 (4-5-5-6). M1. * K9 (10-11-12-13). M1. Rep from * to last 6 (6-7-7-8) sts. K6 (6-7-7-8). 61 (67-73-79-85) sts.

Cont even until work from beg measures 17 (20-20-20-20) ins [43 (51-51-51) cm], ending with RS facing for next row. Knit 9 rows. Cast off loosely knitwise (WS).

Straight Version Only: Change to larger needles and, beg with a knit row, proceed in stocking st until work from beg measures 17 (20-20-20-20) ins [43 (51-51-51) cm], ending with RS facing for next row. Change to smaller needles and knit 9 rows. Cast off loosely knitwise (WS).

FINISHING

Both Versions: Sew back seam.
