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QUICK AND EASY FASHION SCARF

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: **B** Beginner

Quality: Pure Douceur
Pigeon - 29481 (2 balls)



Project Info

One size

Needle Sizes: 5.5mm

Accessories: Wool needle - 64476 (pack of 3)

Stitches Used: **Garter Stitch**, using 5.5mm needles. Knit every row.

Tension/Gauge: 5.5mm

To achieve a good result it is essential to make a tension square: 18 sts & 26 rows using Garter Stitch & 5.5mm needles= 10 cm (4 inch) square

Instructions

The completed scarf measures 20 cm (8 in) wide & 170 cm (67 in) long.

Using 5.5 mm needles cast on 36 sts. Work in Garter St for 170 cm (67 in) [442 rows] total.

Then cast off all sts cutting yarn 10 cm (4 in) from work.

Using a wool needle darn the ends of the yarn through the work for a few stitches along a row then cut off excess yarn.




RUBY RED FAIR ISLE HAT

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: ■ Intermediate

Quality: Ideal

Sizes	2/4	6/8
Citronnier (A) 23040	1 ball	1 ball
Hortensia (B) 20726	1 ball	1 ball
Meije (C) 51253	1 ball	1 ball
Pavot (D) 24408	1 ball	1 ball



Project Info

Needle Sizes: 3 & 3.5mm

Accessories: Pompom maker ref. 61274

Stitches Used: 1/1 Rib, using 3.0 mm needles.

Fair Isle, using 3.5 mm needles. Follow the Chart. To avoid cutting the yarn, use both ends of the ball on colours D, A & B.

Stocking St, using 3.5 mm needles.

Tension/Gauge: To achieve a good result it is essential to make a tension square: 24 sts & 31 rows over St st using 3.5 mm needles = 10 cm (4 in) square.

Instructions

Using 3mm needles and col D CO **107-115** sts. Work in 1/1 rib for 5 cm (2 in) [20 rows] inc 6 sts evenly across final row.

Change to 3.5 mm needles and cont in Fair Isle on the **113-121** sts obtained foll the Chart.

After the **22nd-27th** row of chart cont in St st using col D over all sts for 3-2 rows.

Next row (RS): k1, *k2tog, k6*, rep from *to* (=14-15 dec).

Work **3** rows on the rem 99-106 sts.

Next row (RS): k1,*k2tog, k5*, rep from *to* (=14-15 dec).

Work 3 rows on the rem **85-91** sts.

Work 1 row on the rem **71-76** sts.

Next row (RS): k1, *k2tog, k3* rep from *to*.

Work 1 row on the rem **57-61** sts.

Next row (RS): k1, *k2tog, k2* rep from *to*.

Work 1 row on the rem **43-46** sts.

Next row (RS): k1, *k2tog, k1* rep from *to*.

Work 1 row on the rem **29-31** sts.

Next row (RS): k1, then k2tog across row.

Work 1 row on the rem **15-16** sts.

Next row (RS): 2/4 yrs: k1, then k2tog across row.

6/8 yrs: k2tog across row.

Thread yarn through the rem 8 sts, pull tight & fasten off.

Sew side seam, sewing the bottom 4 cm (1½ in) on the RS to allow for turning up. Secure & weave in all ends.

Make a pompom using col D, 5 cm (2 in) diameter & fix to top of the hat.



**GREAT GREEN SCARF
AND HAT SET**

Hat Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: **E** Easy

Quality: Alaska & Barisienne

One Size	
Alaska – Navy (A) 24545	2 balls
Barisienne – Vert Fluo (B) 59648	1 ball

Project Info

Needle Sizes: 5.5 mm, 1 tapestry needle

Accessories: Pom pom maker 61274

Stitches Used:

Garner Stitch (G. st), Knit all the sts.

Reverse Stocking Stitch (rev St-st),

Row 1: purl. Row 2: knit.

Repeat these 2 rows.

Instructions

Using A cast on 73 sts.

Work in G. st as follows:

- 4 rows A,
- 2 rows B,
- 2 rows A,
- 2 rows B,
- 2 rows A,
- 2 rows B,
- 4 rows A.

Then work 25 rows (13 cm/5 in) with A in rev St-st.

On following row, knit 1, knit 2 together, knit 7, knit 2 together, continue thus to end of row.

65 sts remain.

Purl 1 row, knit 1 row, purl 1 row.

On following row, knit 1, knit 2 together, knit 6, knit 2 together, continue thus to end of row.

57 sts remain.

Purl 1 row, knit 1 row, purl 1 row.

On following row, knit 1, knit 2 together, knit 5, knit 2 together, continue thus to end of row.

49 sts remain.

Purl 1 row, knit 1 row, purl 1 row.

On following row, knit 1, knit 2 together, knit 4, knit 2 together, continue thus to end of row.

41 sts remain.

On following row, purl 1, purl 2 together, purl 3, purl 2 together, continue thus to end of row.

33 sts remain.

On following row, knit 1, knit 2 together, knit 2, knit 2 together, continue thus to end of row.

25 sts remain.

On following row, purl 1, purl 2 together, purl 1, purl 2 together, continue thus to end of row.

17 sts remain.

On following row, knit 2 together, purl 2 together, continue thus to end of row.

9 sts remain.

Cut the yarn, leaving a 20 cm (8 in) length of yarn and thread this through the tapestry needle.

Insert the needle through the 9 sts, remove needle and pull tight, sew a few sts to secure and sew in yarn end neatly along edge.

Seam:

1 Sew seam of turn up (striped part). Turn hat inside out, then continue the seam to point at top (the right side of the hat shows the knit rows).

2 Make a pompon using B and sew it securely to top of hat.

Sew in all loose ends along wrong side edges and trim the ends



Scarf Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: B Beginner

Quality: Barisienne

One Size			
Vert fluo	29648	6 balls	

Project Info

Needle Sizes: 7.0 mm

Accessories: 1 tapestry needle

Stitches Used:

Garner Stitch, knit all the stitches.

The barisienne yarn is knitted using 2 strands together with 7.0 mm needles.

Tension/Gauge: To achieve a good result it is essential to make a tension square: Cast on 20 sts and knit 30 rows in garter stitch. Measure : the tension square should be of 10 cm (4 in) = 13 stitches x 24 rows.

Instructions

The finished scarf measures approximately 20 cm x 2 m (approximately 8 x 78 in).

Cast on 27 stitches.

Work 480 rows (2 m/78 in) in garter stitch.

Cast off all the stitches and cut the yarn, leaving a 10 cm (4 in) length of yarn.

Using a tapestry needle, insert the loose ends along the edges, 2 stitches in from edge across several rows and trim excess yarn.





PARISIAN CHIC ROLLED HAT

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: B Beginner

Quality: Pure Douceur

One Size		
Pigeon	29481	1 ball

Project Info

Needle Sizes: 5.0 and 7.0 mm

Accessories: Wool needle for stitching seams

Stitches Used:

Stocking St, using 5.0 mm & 7.0 mm needles.

Row 1: knit.

Row 2: purl.

Repeat these 2 rows.

Tension/Gauge: To achieve a good result it is essential to make a tension square: 16 sts & 17 rows over St st using 7.0 mm needles = 10 cm (4 in) square.

Instructions

Using 5.0 mm needles cast on 73 sts. Starting with a knit row work in St st for 8 rows, then change to 7.0 mm needles and continue in St st until work measures 15 cm (6 in) (26 rows).

Next row (dec): k1, * k2tog, k7, rep from * to end of row. (= 8 decreases across the row, 65 sts remain).
Work 5 rows on these 65 sts.

Next row (dec): k1, *k2tog, k6, rep from * to end of row. (= 8 decreases across the row, 57 sts remain).
Work 5 rows on these 57 sts.

Next row (dec): k1, *k2tog, k5, rep from * to end of row. (= 8 decreases across the row, 49 sts remain).
Work 5 rows on these 49 sts.

Next row (dec): k1, *k2tog, k4, rep from * to end of row. (41 sts remain).
Work 3 rows on these 41 sts.

Next row (dec): k1, *k2tog, k3, rep from * to end of row. (33 sts remain).
Work 3 rows on these 33 sts.

Next row (dec): k1, *k2tog, k2, rep from * to end of row. (25 sts remain).
Work 3 rows on these 25 sts.

Next row (dec): k1, *k2tog, k1, rep from * to end of row. (17 sts remain).

Work 1 row on these 17 sts.

Next row (dec): k1 *k2tog, rep from * to end of row. (9 sts remain).

Work 1 row on these 9 sts.

Cut the yarn 40 cm from the knitting and pass the yarn through the 9 sts and fasten off.

Fold the hat in half. Stitch the seam, sewing the first 8 rows on the RS of work to allow for the edge to roll back.

Using the wool needle, weave the cut ends of the yarn through the stitches at the edges for a few rows and cut off the extra yarn.



FABULOUSLY FLUFFY SNOOD

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: B Beginner

Quality: Abakan

One Size		
Pétrole	34251	5 balls

Project Info

Needle Sizes: 6.0 mm

Accessories: Wool needle

Stitches Used:

Stocking Stitch (St st), using 6.0 mm needles.

Row 1 (RS): knit.

Row 2: purl.

Repeat these 2 rows.

Tension/Gauge: To achieve a good result it is essential to make a tension square: 15 sts & 19 rows over St st using 6.0 mm needles = 10 cm (4 in) square.

Instructions


The finished snood measured flat is approximately 30 cm (11¾ in) wide & 22 cm (8½ in) long.

Using 6.0 mm needles cast on 33 sts.


Starting with a knit row work in St st for 60 cm (23½ in) [114 rows] total.

Cast off all the sts and cut the yarn 130 cm from the knitting. This yarn will be used to sew the seam. Fold the snood in half (right sides together), matching the points A & A' and B & B', then make a back-stitch seam between AA' to BB' (see instruction pages).

With the wool needle, slip the tail end of the yarn through a few rows at the edge and cut the extra yarn off.

KNIT HAT AND BOOTIES SET

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: **E** Easy

Quality: Ideal

Sizes	0 mo	1 mo	3 mo	6 mo
Everest (A) 51220	2 balls	2 balls	2 balls	2 balls
Eléphant (B) 20547	1 ball	1 ball	1 ball	1 ball

Project Info

Needle Sizes: 3 mm

Stitches Used: **Garter St**, using 3.0 mm needles.
Knit every row.

Tension/Gauge: To achieve a good result it is essential to make a tension square: 24 sts & 48 rows over Garter St using 3.0 mm needles = 10 cm (4 in) square.

Instructions

HAT Newborn/1 mth-3 mths-6 mths

Using Col B cast on **72-79-86** sts.

Working in Garter St work 2 rows Col B, 2 rows Col A, 2 rows Col B, then cont in Col A until work measures **9-10-11** cm (**3½-4-4¼** in)
A[**44-48-52** rows] total.

Next row (RS): k2, *k2tog, k5* rep from *to*
(= **10-11-12** dec).

Work 5 rows on the rem **62-68-74** sts.

Next row (RS): k2, *k2tog, k4* rep from *to*.

Work 5 rows on the rem **52-57-62** sts.

Next row (RS): k2, *k2tog, k3* rep from *to*.

Work 3 rows on the rem **42-46-50** sts.

Next row (RS): k2, *k2tog, k2* rep from *to*.

Work 3 rows on the rem **32-35-38** sts.

Next row (RS): k2, *k2tog, k1* rep from *to*.

Work 1 row on the rem **22-24-26** sts.

Next row (RS): k1, *k2tog, k1* rep from *to*.

Work 1 row on the rem **12-13-14** sts.

Next row (RS):

Newborn/1 mth & 6 mths: k2tog across row.

3 mths: k1, then k2tog across row.

Work 1 row on the rem **6-7-7** sts.

Cut yarn approx. 20 cm (8 in) from work, thread onto a wool needle & thread through the remaining sts, pull tight & fasten off.

Sew side seam.

BOOTEES:

Begin with the sole.

Using Col A cast on **23-25-27-29** sts. Work in Garter St for 2 rows.

Next row: k1, inc 1, k **10-11-12-13**, inc 1, k1, inc 1, k **10-11-12-13**, inc 1, k1.

Work 1 row of knit on the **27-29-31-33** sts obtained.

Next row: k1, inc 1, k **12-13-14-15**, inc 1, k1, inc 1, k **12-13-14-15**, inc 1, k1.

Work 1 row of knit on the **31-33-35-37** sts obtained.

Next row: k1, inc 1, k **14-15-16-17**, inc 1, k1, inc 1, k **14-15-16-17**, inc 1, k1.

Work 1 row of knit on the **35-37-39-41** sts obtained.

Next row: k1, inc 1, k **16-17-18-19**, inc 1, k1, inc 1, k **16-17-18-19**, inc 1, k1.

Work 1 row of knit on the **39-41-43-45** sts obtained.

Next row: k1, inc 1, k **18-19-20-21**, inc 1, k1, inc 1, k **18-19-20-21**, inc 1, k1.

Work 5 rows of Garter St on the **43-45-47-49** sts obtained.

Top of foot:

Next row: k **20-21-22-23**, sl 2, k1, pass over 2 slipped sts, k **20-21-22-23**.

Work 1 row of knit on the rem **41-43-45-47** sts.

Instructions

Next row: k 19-20-21-22, sl 2, k1, pssso, k 19-20-21-22.

Work 1 row of knit on the rem 39-41-43-45 sts.

Next row: k 18-19-20-21, sl 2, k1, pssso, k 18-19-20-21.

Work 1 row of knit on the rem 37-39-41-43 sts.

Next row: k 17-18-19-20, sl 2, k1, pssso, k 17-18-19-20.

Work 1 row of knit on the rem 35-37-39-41 sts.

Next row: k 16-17-18-19, sl 2, k1, pssso, k 16-17-18-19.

Work 1 row of knit on the rem 33-35-37-39 sts.

Next row: k 15-16-17-18, sl 2, k1, pssso, k 15-16-17-18.

Cuff:

Work 8-10-12-14 rows of G St on the rem 31-33-35-37 sts.

Turn down:

You are now on the WS of work, end with 2 rows Col B, 2 rows Col A, 2 rows Col B, then cast off all sts knitwise on the WS of work.

Sew the seam, sewing the turn down seam on the RS to allow for turning down. Hold turn down in place with a few sts using sewing needle & thread.





**FIRESIDE KNIT
MAXI SNOOD**

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: B Beginner

Quality: Pure Mérinos Français & Pure Douceur

One Size	
Pur Merinos Français – Souris (A) 29134	5 balls
Pure Douceur – Pigeon (B) 29481	5 balls

Project Info

Needle Sizes: 5 mm

Accessories: 1 wool needle

Stitches Used: The snood is made using a strand of colour A and a strand of colour B knitted together. Prepare the yarn before starting by winding the two balls together.

Garter St (G-St), using 2 strands of yarn & 5.0 mm needles.

Row 1 (RS): Knit.

Repeat Row 1 throughout.

Tension/Gauge:

To achieve a good result it is essential to make a tension square: 15.5 sts and 28 rows over G-St using 2 strands of yarn together and 5.0 mm needles = 10 cm (4 in) square.

Instructions

Cast off all the sts and cut the yarn 80 cm (31½ in) from the work. This will be used to sew the seam. Fold the snood in half and using the wool needle stitch the side seam. Slip the remaining yarn through a few stitches and cut off. Secure and weave in all ends in the same way.





KNIT MUK LUKS SLIPPERS

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: I Intermediate

Quality: Magic+

Sizes		36/38	39/41
Gynura	23250	5 balls	5 balls

Project Info

Needle Size: 5 mm

Crochet Hook Sizes: 3.5 mm

Accessories: Soles for sewing size 36/38 ref 30864 – size 39/41 ref 30867. Pompom maker ref 61274.

Stitches used

Stocking st (St st), using 5.0 mm needles.

Reverse Stocking st (Rev St st), using 5.0 mm needles.

Tension/Gauge:

To achieve a good result it is essential to make a tension square: 17 sts and 23 rows over St st using 5.0 mm needles = 10 cm (4 in) square.

Instructions

1st & 2nd pieces (make 2 alike):

CO **26-30** sts.

Row 1: k **2-3**, p2, k2, p2, k **10-12**, p2, k2, p2, k **2-3**.

Row 2: Work the sts as they appear.

This sets the patt, cont until work measures 8.5 cm (3½ in) [20 rows] total.

Next row (dec): k **2-3**, p2, k2, p2, k **3-4**, sl1, k1, pssso, k2tog, k **3-4**, p2, k2, p2, k **2-3**.

Rep these decs in the same place as before on every 10th row 4 times, working 1 st less before the pssso and 1 st less after the k2tog.

When work measures **30-34** cm (**12-13½** in) [**72-82** rows] total, leave the rem **16-20** sts on a spare needle.

Heel:

Pick up the **16-20** sts from each of the 2 pieces on the same needle. Leaving the 1st and last **7-9** sts unworked, cont on the central **18-22** sts as folls:

Sl the 1st st, k **6-8**, sl1, k1, pssso, k2tog, k **7-9**.

Cont in St st, leaving 1 st unworked at the beg of every row until there are 6 sts in the centre.

Cont in St st, working 1 extra st at the beg of every row until there are **16-20** sts on the needle.

Foot:

Work across all **30-38** sts for **14-16** cm (**5½-6¼** in) [**30-36** rows].

Toe:

Next row (dec): k **2-3**, p2, k2, p1, k2tog, sl1, k1, pssso, k **8-14**, k2tog, sl1, k1, pssso, p1, k2, p2, k **2-3**.

This row sets the pattern, rep these decs in the same place as before by working 1 st less at the start & end of the decs and 2 sts less at the centre decs on every alt row twice, then every row **1-2** times.

Close the end of the toe by grafting the rem **14-18** sts and working together the 1st and last 2 sts.

TO MAKE UP

Using the 4.5 mm crochet hook make a chain approx 90 cm in length and lace the back of the sock as folls: pass the chain through the 1st purl st at each edge and cross every 8th row. Crochet a second chain approx 110 cm in length and lace the top of the foot and front of sock in the same way as for the back. Make 4 pompoms approx 3 cm diameter and fix each of them to a chain end. Stitch on the soles using cross stitch.



EGGNOG KNIT SCARF

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: **B** Beginner

Quality: Recyclaine

One Size	
Lin 32798	4 balls

Project Info

Needle Size: 10 mm

Stitches Used

Garner St - Knit every row.

Tension/Gauge:

8 sts & 12 rows using 10 mm needles & Garner St = 10 cm (4 in) square. Important: If you have less stitches and rows over a 10 cm tension. square try again using smaller needles. Use larger needles if you obtain more stitches and rows than required.

Instructions

Using 10 mm needles cast on 20 sts.

Work in Garner St for 200 rows.

Cast off all sts and cut yarn 10 cm (4 in) from work.

Using a wool needle weave yarn through a few sts at the back of work and cut off excess yarn.

The completed scarf measures approx. 25 cm (10 in) x 165 cm (65 in).





**GRENDALINE FAUX
FUR SNOOD**

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: E Easy

Quality: Abakan

One Size		
Grenadine	32486	5 balls
or Noir	32492	5 balls
or Pétrole	32477	5 balls

Project Info

Needle Size: 6 mm

Accessories: 1 Fastener ref 42362.

Stitches used

Stocking St (St-St)

Row 1: k

Row 2: p

Repeat these 2 rows.s.

Tension:

15 sts & 19 rows using 6.0 mm needles & Stocking St = 10 cm (4 in) square.

Important: If you have less stitches and rows over a 10 cm tension square try again using smaller needles. Use larger needles if you obtain more stitches and rows than required.

Instructions

Using 6.0 mm needles cast on 36 sts.

Starting with a knit row work in Stocking St for 120 rows.

Cast off all sts and cut thread 10 cm (4 in) from work.

Using a wool needle weave yarn through a few sts at the back of work and cut off excess yarn.

The completed snood measures approx. 24 cm (9½ in) x 62 cm (24½ in).

TO MAKE UP

Prepare fastener: to aid fixing to garment, pierce the section of the fastener that will be sewn to garment at regular intervals (using a sewing machine or a sewing needle).

Using a sewing needle, sew the looped section to the left edge 5 cm (2 in) from the top letting the loop protrude. Sew the other section to the right at the same height 18 cm (7 in) from edge.







SPEARMINT CABLE HAT

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: E Easy

Quality: Barisienne, Chinaillon

Sizes	6/8 years
Barisienne – Vert Fluo (A) 29648 Chinaillon – Anthracite (B) 29805	2 balls 1 ball



Project Info

Needle Size: 3.0 mm & 4.0 mm needles – Cable Needle (cn)

Accessories: Pompom maker ref. 612.741.

Stitches used

1/1 Rib, using col A & 3.0 mm needles.

Stocking St & Reverse Stocking St, using col A & 4.0 mm needles.

Cable, using col A & 4.0 mm needles. Over 4 sts.

Row 1 (RS): knit.

Row 2 & 4: purl.

Row 3: 4CL (= slip 2 sts onto cn at front of work, k2, then k2 from cn).

After Row 4 rep from Row 1.

Tension:

15 sts & 19 rows using 6.0 mm needles & Stocking St = 10 cm (4 in) square.

Important: If you have less stitches and rows over a 10 cm tension square try again using smaller needles. Use larger needles if you obtain more stitches and rows than required.

Instructions

Using 3.0 mm needles & col A CO 115 sts.

Work in 1/1 rib for 6 cm (2¼ in) [22 rows] but work final row as foll: 6 sts 1/1 rib, *inc 1, 13 sts 1/1 rib* rep from *to* 7 more times, then inc 1, 5 sts 1/1 rib.

Change to 4.0 mm needles & work on the 124 sts obtained as foll:

3 sts St st,

1 st Rev St st, 4 sts Cable, 1 st Rev St st,

8 sts St st, 1 st Rev St st, 4 sts Cable, 1 st Rev St st rep from *to* 7 more times, then 3 sts St st.

When work measures 15 cm (6 in) [50 rows] total work next RS row as foll:

K3, p1, 4 sts Cable,

p2tog, k6, p2tog, 4 sts Cable

rep from *to* 7 more times, then p1, k3.

Work 3 rows on the rem 108 sts.

Next row (RS):

k3, p1, 4 sts Cable, *p2tog, k4, p2tog, 4 sts Cable* rep from *to* 7 more times, then p1, k3.

Work 3 rows on the rem 92 sts.

Next row (RS):

k3, p1, 4 sts Cable, *p2tog, k2, p2tog, 4 sts Cable* rep from *to* 7 more times, then p1, k3.

Work 3 rows on the rem 76 sts.

Next row (RS):

k3, p1, 4 sts Cable, *p2tog twice, 4 sts Cable* rep from *to* 7 more times, then p1, k3.

Work 3 rows on the rem 60 sts.

Next row (RS):

k2, *p2t<4og, 4 sts Cable* rep from *to* 8 more times, then k2tog, k2.

Work 1 row on the rem 50 sts.

Next row (RS):

k1, *k<42tog, k3* rep from *to* 8 more times, k2tog, k2.

Work 1 row of purl on the rem 40 sts.

Next row (RS):

k2tog, k2 rep from *to* 9 more times.

Work 1 row of purl on the rem 30 sts.

Next row (RS): k2tog across row.

Thread yarn through the rem 15 sts, pull tight & fasten off.

Sew the side seam, sewing the bottom 3 cm (1¼ in) on the RS to allow for turning up.

Secure & weave in all ends.

Using col B make a pompom, 6 cm (2½ in) diameter & fix to the top of the hat.

HENRY THE HEDGEHOG PATTERN

Difficulty/Yarn Materials

Difficulty: I Intermediate

Quality: Abakan, Sport

Dimensions approximately 22 cm (9 in) high	
Abakan – Noir (A) 34242	2 balls
Sport – Kraft (B) 21120	1 ball



Project Info

Needle Size: 3.5 mm

Accessories: Stuffing fibre Ref 14890 (250g bag)

1 sewing needle and black thread

Stitches used

1/1 Rib, Single crochet, (uk: double crochet) = sc (uk: dc) using 3.5 mm crochet hook:

Row 1 (RS of work): 1 sc (uk: dc) into 2nd ch and into every foll ch st.

2nd and every foll row: 1 ch, 1 sc (uk: dc) into 1st sc (uk: dc) and every foll sc (uk: dc).

Abbreviations:

ch or ch st = chain st

sc = single crochet (uk: dc = double crochet)

sl st = slip stitch.

2 sc tog (uk: 2 dc tog) = 2 single crochets together (uk: = 2 double crochets together):

* leaving last loop of each st on the hook, work incomplete sc (dc) as foll: Insert hook into a st, yo and draw up loop, insert hook into next st, yo and draw up loop, yo and through all rem 3 loops at once.

Instructions

Start with the front.

FRONT:

Using col B make a chain foundation of 13 sts.

Crochet in sc (uk: dc) [= 12 sc (uk: dc)], inc at each end 1 sc (uk: dc) 3 times every 2nd row.

To inc 1 st at each end: Crochet 2 sc (uk: dc) on the 1st and last sc (uk: dc).

After the last inc, crochet 3 rows on the 18 sc (uk: dc) obtained, then dec at each end 1 sc (uk: dc) 5 times every 2nd row, 1 sc (uk: dc) once on foll row.

To dec 1 sc (uk: dc) at each end: Crochet 1 ch., then 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog) on the 2 first dc (uk: sc), cont the row and when 2 sc (uk: dc) remain at end of row, crochet 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog).

= 6 sc (uk: dc)

The front is complete. Do not fasten off.

HEAD:

Following on from front, make a 34 sts ch. Close the round with 1 sl st into the 1st sc (uk: dc) of last row of front (= 40 sts).

Then, crochet as foll:

Rounds 1 and 2: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk: dc) into each st, join these rounds and every foll round by working 1 sl st into the 1st sc (uk: dc) of the beg of round (= 40 sts).

Round 3: 1 ch, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk: dc) into each of the foll 6 sts *, rep from * to * (= 35 sc (uk: dc).)

Round 4: 1 ch, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk: dc) into each of foll 5 sts *, rep from * to * (= 30 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 5: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk: dc) into each st.

Round 6: 1 ch, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk: dc) into each of foll 4 sts *, rep from * to * (= 25 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 7: 1 ch, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk: dc) into each of foll 3 sts *, rep from * to * (= 20 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 8: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk: dc) into each st.

Round 9: 1 ch, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk: dc) into each of foll 2 sts *, rep from * to * (= 15 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 10: 1 ch, then * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk: dc) into foll st *, rep from * to * (= 10 sc (uk: dc)).

Rounds 11, 12, 13: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk: dc) into each st.

After Round 13, insert yarn through the 10 sc (uk: dc), pull tight and fasten off.

EARS (2):

Using col B form a ring, then crochet as foll:

Round 1: 1 ch, 6 sc (uk: dc) into ring.

Round 2: 1 ch, 2 sc (uk: dc) into 1st st, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of foll 4 sts, 2 sc (uk: dc) into last st. (= 8 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 3: 1 ch, 2 sc (uk: dc) into 1st st, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of foll 2 sts, 2 sc (uk: dc) into foll st, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of foll 3 sts, 2 sc (uk: dc) into last st. (= 11 sc (uk:dc)) and fasten off.

Pull yarn tight to close the ring.

PAWS (4):

Using col B form a ring, then crochet as foll:

Round 1: 1 ch 8 sc (uk: dc) into ring, close this round and every foll round into a ring by crocheting 1 sl st into 1st sc (uk: dc) at beg of round.

Round 2: 1 ch, 2 sc (uk: dc) into the 1st st, 1 sc (uk:dc) into foll st, * 2 sc (uk: dc) into the foll st, 1 sc (uk:dc) into next st *, crochet 3 times from * to * (= 12 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 3: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk:dc) into each st taking the back loop.

Rounds 4 and 5: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk:dc) into each st.

Round 6: 1 ch, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk:dc) *, crochet 4 times from * to * and fasten off.

BACK:

Using col A , crochet around front and head as foll:

Round 1: 1 sl st, 1 ch, then 32 sc (uk: dc) around the head and 51 sc (uk:dc) around front, close this round and every foll round by 1 sl st into the 1st sc (uk: dc) at beg of round. (= 83 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 2: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk:dc) into each st.

Round 3: 1 ch, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of first 2 sts, * 2 sc (uk: dc) into the foll st, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of 2 foll sts *, rep from * to * (= 110 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 4: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk:dc) into each st.

Round 5: 1 ch, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of first 2 sts, * 2 sc (uk: dc) into the foll st, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of 2 foll sts *, rep from * to * (= 146 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 6: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk:dc) into each st.

Round 7: 1 ch, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of first 2 sts, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk:dc) into foll st *, rep from * to * (= 98 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 8: 1 ch, 1 sc (uk:dc) into each of first 2 sts, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk:dc) into foll st *, rep from * to * (= 66 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 9: 1 ch, * 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), 1 sc (uk:dc) into foll st *, rep from * to * (= 44 sc (uk: dc)).

Round 10: 1 ch, then 22 times 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog).

Round 11: 1 ch, then 11 times 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog).

Round 12: 1 ch, then 1 sc (uk:dc) into each st.

Stuff the hedgehog.

Round 13: 1 ch, 1 sc (uk:dc) into the 1st st, (2 sc tog (uk: dc tog)) 5 times.

Round 14: 1 ch, 3 times 2 sc tog (uk: dc tog), then insert yarn through the rem 3 sc (uk: dc), pull tight and fasten off.

Using the needle and black thread, embroider nose using straight st, and the eyes using French knot st. Sew paws onto front.

Secure and weave in ends.






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
